

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
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# INTRODUCTION

## BOOKS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT FACT FILES



Welcome to *Old Testament Fact Files*, Bible lookup sheets and games to help your students learn about all the books in the Old Testament! Students can play games and relays, or just sit in groups and help each other learn all the classic Old Testament Bible lookups, for which this series is fantastic!

The sure benefit is that your students will have the big picture of the Old Testament after completing these worksheets. They will know what occurred in the 39 different books, and when each was written or took place.

You can use the package as a comprehensive study to help students ages 7 & up learn the Old Testament. Or you can bring out pages on a per-need basis while completing other studies. Flexibility is key, so let's look at the package and all the ways to use it.

### What's Inside

Enclosed are 22 *Old Testament Fact File* sheets, each covering one or more books of the Old Testament. Most of the worksheets cover one book. However, we have doubled up on some that children and teenagers generally don't study in depth. A complete list of all 22 worksheets is included in the Table of Contents, and the learning tool "Books of the Old Testament & Their Dates," located on page 11.

### On each sheet are the following:

Background Information on each book is found at the top of each worksheet and is generally one paragraph long. Each paragraph contains five or six blanks to be filled in with the choice of answers at the paragraph's end.

The fill-ins are not hard and do not require a lookup, though children 9 & younger may require assistance. The fill-ins make the paragraph work like a puzzle. It will only make complete sense when all five blanks have been filled in correctly. As the answers are an array of numbers, verbs, adjectives, and nouns, it isn't too challenging to get the right word into its blank.

The fill-in-the-blank paragraph will give students an overview of the book.

**Seven Bible Lookup Questions** follow on each sheet, and generally they cover the most beloved, classic, or well-known scriptures from that book. Students will have to complete lookups to answer these seven multiple-choice questions (NIV translation is recommended.).

The multiple-choice questions will familiarize students with some of the important details of the books.

**A Bible Bookshelf** on each page repeats the dates of when each book occurred in history. Because it can be colored in, students will be giving repeated attention to Bible books and dates.

## **Also in this package find the following:**

**Teacher's Answer Sheets** are provided for all 22 worksheets. They provide the answers for the fill-in-the-blank questions as well as the multiple-choice answers for the Bible lookups. They require a color printer as the ink is in gray, and the answers are marked in **red**.

**Two games** are included, which you can use for reinforcement after students have filled in the worksheets. One gets them up and moving (relay), while the other is great for concentrating. Use both for optimal reinforcement or just one!

**Books of the Old Testament in Order with Dates** is one sheet that students can have in the middle of the table while completing the Bible lookups. It lists the books in order and is yet another source for when the events of each book occurred.

## **How to Use the Old Testament Worksheets**

### **Don't let younger children work unsupervised**

You will achieve optimal learning if you remain present when children are filling out answers—especially children 9 & under. For many children this series may be their first exposure to the basics of God's precious Word. Children need teachers and parents to help them along with it. While picking the important scriptures from each book, editors have strived to give children the big picture of what is going on. Therefore the series will ignite questions, and you should be available to guide them. Hence, we only suggest using this series as a send-home sheet or unsupervised fill-in sheet if children are 10 & older.

### **Allow plenty of time for students who are new to Bible lookups**

Some of the Bible passages require children to read more than one verse—sometimes as many as 10, such as the very cool description of Ezekiel's wheel! Therefore don't expect students to whip through these lookups in 10 minutes. The time you will need will depend on the ages of students and their abilities. In the cases where the scriptures involve stories, half an hour supervised will most likely suffice.

### **Incorporating teamwork**

Teamwork makes learning more fun and can optimize retention! Here are some ideas on incorporating teamwork:

If you teach a mixed-age group, it pays to pair one older child with a younger child. Children as young as seven should be learning how to navigate the Bible, and the bookshelf at the top of each page should help. A younger child can do the Bible lookups. His older partner will have the brainpower it takes to read the questions, consider the choices, and clarify options with the younger child. They can derive the answer together.

### **Use the bookshelf to give the books time & order placement**

Once students are through answering both fill-ins and multiple-choice answers, ask them to point to

the colored book at the top and consider where it is on the bookshelf, which will help them picture where it is in their Bible. Then ask them to consider the dates of the events. Are those dates close to the birth of Christ? Close to the time of the kings? Close to the time of King David? They can color the books in with different colors of pencils, which will reinforce the dates of Bible books.

### **Use the Games for Reinforcement**

We're suggesting two games your students can play with the sheets for reinforcement. The games just add fun and intrigue! They follow in this introductory section.


### **Why This Package is Important**

We don't just want children to know the names of the Bible books or be able to recite a dozen important verses. By the time students are halfway through their Sunday school years, we want them to start getting an overview picture of the story God is telling in this one amazing book.

The Bible is 66 books with more than 40 authors, written over a period of 1,500 years. They all had their own styles, perspectives, eras, and challenges to deal with. However, the more one reads the Bible, the more one is able to see clearly that it is ONE ongoing story—God's message to mankind—and it still inspires as many people today as it ever did! Your students will begin to understand this and thus become closer to God as they unveil his secrets... one book and author at a time!

## GAME #1: WORKSHEET TABLE RELAYS

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This game should be played immediately after students fill out a worksheet and have gone over the answers. To make minds sharp for the game, have them put their own worksheets down while you read questions from the Teachers' Answer Sheets, and have them blurt the correct answers until many are getting them.


### **Preparation**

1. Post two blank copies of the Old Testament Fact File sheet that was filled out in class on different ends of the learning table (so that teams cannot see each other's answer sheets and copy from them).
2. Place a Bible and a pencil beside each sheet.
3. Form two teams and have teams line up, one behind the other, at either end of the table.
4. When you say "Go!" the first student on each team will fill in an answer. It can be any answer they feel most certain about (it doesn't have to be the first one), but they can only fill in one. Other teammates may not rush, or irritate the person whose turn it is. They may NOT tell him the answer. When the teammate is finished, he should leave the pencil and go to the back of the line.
5. The next student may fill in a second answer, and so on, until the entire sheet is completed again by one team.
6. Toward the end of the round, students may find themselves having to look up answers again. The Bible is there for that purpose, though no student is forced to do a lookup in this game. The other option is to guess.
7. When one of the teams completes a worksheet, the round ends. The other team will have some blanks. Using the Teacher's Answer Sheet, check the sheets, using the following rules to score:
  - a. Deduct 5 points for every answer that is left blank.
  - b. Deduct 10 points for every incorrect answer.
  - c. Add 10 points for every correct answer.
8. The team with the highest score wins that round.
9. Complete as many rounds as you wish with the same worksheet to improve comprehension.

**Note:** Students will feel great urges to resist taking time for Bible lookups. However, wrong answers can be extremely costly. So can blank answers for the time taken for Bible lookups! Encourage them to look up in future rounds if they did not learn their lesson this time.

## GAME #2: BIBLE BACKGROUND HANDS-DOWN

### BOOKS OF THE **OLD TESTAMENT** FACT FILES



Remember the game “Hands Down” from your childhood? Here’s an easy likeness! This game involves slapping the answer on the index card that contains the correct fill-in-the-blank answer from the worksheet. The game will reinforce the background information on the Bible book or books covered on a Old Testament Fact File sheet.

As with Game #1, this game should be played immediately after students fill out a worksheet and have gone over the answers. To make minds sharp for the game, have them put their own worksheets down while you read questions from the Teachers’ Answer Sheets, and have them blurt the correct answers until many are getting them.

### **Materials**

- Old Testament Fact File Sheet, one copy for each student
- Two Bibles in NIV translation
- Pencils
- Index cards

### **Preparation**

Using the Teacher’s Answer Sheet, write the five or six words that are answers to the fill-in-the-blank section on separate index cards.

### **Rules & Instructions**

1. After the students have filled out their worksheets and gone over the answers, have them turn their papers over so they can no longer see the questions or answers.
2. Lay out the index cards with the answers written on them on the table.
3. Have students stand up so they can reach any of the cards as easily as anyone else.
4. Read the background paragraph on each book or books, using the word “blank” when you come to it. At the end of a sentence stop, unless a sentence has TWO blanks (which is rare). In that case, stop at the end of the first THOUGHT, including the first blank.
5. The student who first slaps the card containing the answer wins the card. (You will be able to tell who slapped the answer first, because his hand will be on the bottom if there are lots of students.)
6. That student may take the card into his possession.
7. Repeat until all the questions have been read.
8. The student with the most cards at the round end wins the round.
9. Lay out all the answers again and play again, leaving off the first winner. Complete another round with the remaining students.
10. Repeat rounds, eliminating winners, as many times as you wish.

# THE BOOKS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT IN ORDER WITH DATES

This list is to help you find the Book of the Bible you are investigating. The books also include the dates that the events included in the text took place. The books are repeated on each worksheet page, but some students find the straight list easier to read.

You may be surprised to see that the Bible is NOT put together chronologically (in order of time)! For example, the latest events in the Old Testament occur in the Book of Nehemiah, ending around 432 BC. However, Nehemiah is Book #12 on the list below—not 22! And the Minor Prophets, all in #22, took place starting in 781 BC and not ending until 450 BC.

Most of these dates are estimated. We do not know exactly when Adam was born or what year began the creation of the earth and skies. But most Bible experts agree that the dates below are close, though some think there may be 100 years in difference.

Use this list and the timelines on each page to help you picture when all the important events in the Bible happened.
