Bottom Line:

Jesus shows love to people in need.

1. Jesus stopped to help the woman even though He was already on His way to heal Jairus' daughter. What does that tell you about what's important to Jesus—and how can that change the way you think about interruptions in your own life?
2. The woman who touched Jesus' clothes had been suffering for 12 years. Why do you think Jesus wanted her to come forward and tell her story instead of just letting her be healed in secret?

Discussion Questions continued

Bottom Line:

Jesus shows love to people in need.

3. When people told Jairus his daughter was dead, Jesus said, "Don't be afraid. Just believe" (Mark 5:36).
What do you think it means to "just believe" when everything feels hopeless or scary?
4. Both the woman and Jairus had to push through fear and take a step of faith to reach Jesus. Can you think of a time when you needed to show faith or courage to ask God for help—or to help someone else?
5. Jesus made time for people in need, even when others thought it was too late or too small. How can you make time in your own day to notice people who might need love, encouragement, or help?



LOVE GAME

What You Do:

1. Give each kid a “Love Game” Activity Page and a pair of scissors.
2. Guide them through the process of cutting it, coloring it, and folding it using the “Love Game Folding Instructions” Activity Page.
3. Once it’s folded, encourage the kids to look at the different sections.
4. Let them play with the cootie catchers with a partner. One person picks a letter, spells it out while opening and closing the cootie catcher, picks a number, counts it out, and then reads the message of love inside

1. Write out the memory verse on a white board then have all the kids say it together.
2. slowly remove a few of the words from the verse and have them recite the whole verse with the missing words.
3. Keep doing this until you do not have any more words left on the white board and have them recite the whole verse



Prayer Requests

- Hand out one note card and a pen to each kid.
- Tell students to write down one or more prayer requests on their card.

These can be personal needs, concerns, or anything they want prayed over.

3. Give students a quiet moment to write.

Allow enough time for kids to think and fill out their cards without rushing.

4. Collect all note cards at the end.

Place the cards in your bags to take home.

5. Pray over the note cards throughout the week.

Show us the people around us who need Your love this week. Give us the courage to not just walk by, but to stop and show them Your love in a real way.
